They are used in Key Stages 1, 2 and 3 for English, maths and science. Each level is divided into three sub-levels, with A at the top end and C at the lower end, so Level 1C is the lowest and Level 8A the highest.

The Hardenhuish Key Stage 3 assessment system is based on a 1 (lowest) to 9 (highest) grade scale. The knowledge, understanding and skills needed for each grade have been set so that the grade a pupil is working at during Key Stage 3 broadly reflects the standard we would expect a pupil to be at in order to progress to achieve the same grade at GCSE.
